Purpose:

The CP Football Development Officer will be responsible for strategic coordination of cerebral palsy football and frame football nationally. Working across wider football networks the officer will be responsible for retaining and growing the number of CP football teams, players, workforce development, and leading the growth of the CP National Football League.

The post holder will ensure that people with cerebral palsy and associated physical impairments are at the heart of CP football. The post holder will also contribute to wider Cerebral Palsy Sport priorities and programmes.

The post has been created in partnership with The FA. The post will be overseen by a management group including Cerebral Palsy Sport and The FAs National Development Manager – Disability Pathway.

Job Description

Key duties and responsibilities:

- Unite the game through the strategic coordination of all CP and Frame football provision at a national level.
- Retain and grow the number of affiliated CP football teams with a particular emphasis on the growth within England Football Accredited Club structures.
- To achieve targets set over the year, reporting directly to The FA.
- Influence and support County FAs (and partners) to deliver FA participations programmes that are inclusive of CP participants.
- Support sustainable, modern and fit for purpose national competition structures, addressing gaps where they exist, ensuring all FA guidelines are adhered to.





- Ensure the workforce is adequate to develop CP football and is supported and developed across coaches, referees, classifiers, volunteers and young leaders.
- Support in the delivery of a marketing and communication plan to raise the profile of CP Football and to raise awareness of the pathway opportunities.
- Embed research, insight and effective measurement into planning and decision making across CP football to ensure programmes meet the needs of disabled people.
- Help identify and support players to access and exit the disability football talent pathway.
- To lead the Frame Football Development Group.
- To support CP Sport with all aspects of the Strategy.
- To support the roll out and delivery of the CP Sport Regional Hubs.
