Purpose: <p>The National CP Football League is coordinated by volunteers to provide CP Football clubs with regional and national competition. The league runs 6 fixture rounds a season, on a monthly basis, as well as coordinating the National CP Cup. Winners of the league and cup play each other in the Cerebral Palsy Cup final at St. George's Park as well as being streamed live on BT Sport.</p> <p>The League Committee are recruiting a new Match Day Coordinator and is an opportunity to be part of an incredible journey, as well as offering a variety of learning experiences, working within a passionate and driven team.</p>
